FAITH COMMUNITY NURSING

Topic: COPD Awareness

More than 11.7 million Americans live with COPD, or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. COPD is a condition involving constriction of the airways and difficulty or discomfort in breathing. Symptoms include shortness of breath, wheezing, or a chronic cough. Bronchitis is a type of COPD where increased mucous and inflammation cause chronic pulmonary symptoms and infections. The other main type of COPD is emphysema, where disease is caused by the destruction and enlargement of air spaces in the lungs. Tobacco use accounts for >70% of the cases of COPD in the U.S. Rescue inhalers and inhaled or oral steroids can help control symptoms and minimize further damage, but it is imperative to see your doctor for full evaluation if you are experiencing the symptoms described above.
